Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Acts 2: 14, 22-23; Psalm 15; 1 Peter 1: 17-21; Luke 24: 13-35 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

"'I am love and mercy itself. There is no misery that could be a match for My mercy, neither will misery exhaust it, because as it is being granted - it increases. The soul that trusts in My mercy are most fortunate because I Myself take care of it." St Faustina's Diary (No. 1273). Dear sisters and brothers, today we celebrate the feast of DIVINE MERCY. On the Second Sunday of Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the Canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska, Pope John Paul II declared the Sunday after Easter be called "Divine Mercy Sunday". St. Faustina was a Polish nun who received visions from Jesus, including one of Jesus wearing a white garment with beams of red and white coming from His heart, which came to be known as the image of Divine Mercy. She wrote in her diary that He said, "I want the Image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it...My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy". According to the vision, those who receive Communion and attend confession on the Feast of Mercy receive total forgiveness of sins. Therefore, Divine Mercy Sunday focuses on the gift of mercy and love given through Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. As Pope John Paul II stated, "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified."

The first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, explains how the risen Lord continued to show His Divine Mercy to the sick through the healing and preaching ministry of the apostles in the early Church. The faith of the apostles enabled them to minister to the people, giving them the Lord's healing love in "signs and wonders". These healings illustrate how the power of the Resurrection can work miracles, even through ordinary people. We know that this power of the Resurrection still operates today because we have seen how a friendly smile, a gentle touch or a willingness to forgive can heal a broken spirit, and how the challenging words of a parent, a teacher or a friend can quicken the mind and heart. In today's gospel, Jesus visited his timid disciples. This gospel teaches us that our faith is distinct from mere sensible knowledge. This visit to his disciples was very significant, first to convince them that he was real. Second, to restore their faith and peace. Hence, he said to them: "Peace be with you". Third, it was to empower them spiritually. So, "He breathed on them saying: Receive the Holy Spirit". Christ's visit restored their courage and faith. However, it took time for Thomas to believe that Christ had risen. Doubt and fear make it difficult for one to believe the wonders that God has worked by resurrecting Christ. Therefore, we must expel the spirit of doubt and fear from our lives in order to experience the power of the resurrected Christ. Let us embrace the peace that Christ brings us this Easter. The power of Christ's resurrection brings healing and peace to our body and soul. It also restores us to life. This was the reason why Jesus rose from the dead. Paul says of this power, "If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies" (Rom. 8, 11). Today, Jesus reassures us of His living presence with us in a more tangible, powerful, and glorified way. We, therefore, need to tap from His power to live as he lives. However, before we can experience this power and witness it as the apostles did, we must first cast away all doubts and fears. Hence, our situation must shift from doubting to the manifestation of a living and active faith in the risen Christ. May the Risen Christ envelop us in His Divine Mercy. Fr. George Mathew SCJ.
