Next Sunday's Mass Readings Isaiah 55:10-11; Psalm 64; Romans 8:18-23; Matthew 13:1-23 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Amid turmoil and adversity of this modern day, the readings of this Sunday bring us a message of hope, trust, and reliance on God's strength. The prophet Zechariah speaks of an eschatological future were Jesus the king who will come to restore the kingdom, bringing justice and peace. The promise of a new beginning and the restoration of their homeland must have been difficult to believe in the face of despair and uncertainty. Yet, through Zechariah's words, God's promise shines as a beacon of hope, reminding the people that even in the darkest moments, God remains faithful and has a plan for their restoration.

Through the Gospel reading of today, Jesus invites us to find rest and solace in Him. He acknowledges the burdens we carry, the struggles we face, and He offers to share our yoke, to lighten our load. Jesus assures us that the demands of God are not beyond our strength. He invites us to turn to Him, to place our trust in Him, and to seek His help when life becomes overwhelming. This message is profoundly relevant in our own lives. We too encounter moments when we feel overwhelmed, burdened by the challenges and trials, both spiritual and material that come our way. We may face personal struggles, societal unrest, or the weight of expectations and responsibilities. In those moments, it is easy to rely solely on our own strength, to become consumed by worry and doubt. But the readings remind us that we are not alone. Jesus understands our burdens because He carried the weight of the world upon His own shoulders. He invites us to come to Him, to surrender our anxieties, and to find solace in His gentle and compassionate presence. Turning to Jesus in our times of need requires humility, faith, and a willingness to let go of our self-reliance. It means acknowledging that we cannot navigate life's challenges alone, we are not supposed to; and that we need the help of our loving Saviour. It involves surrendering our burdens and allowing Him to navigate us along the path of righteousness, justice, and peace.

Jesus is the revelation of God. However, to fully grasp that revelation we must approach him in humility, openness and lowliness. That is why Jesus' message was received by outcasts, sinners, publicans and others rejected by society. These are the little ones Jesus talks about. Their acceptance of Jesus was not compromised by status, pride, a know-it-all attitude or being judgmental of others. They knew who they were and who they were not. The passage urges believers to live according to the Spirit and put to death the deeds of the flesh, for those who live according to the flesh will not inherit eternal life. Throughout the Church's history, this contrast between the flesh and the spirit has led to many distorted ideas about holiness. One such thought was that, to grow in holiness meant to reject not only the flesh, but everything material. In the first chapter of Genesis, we hear that "God looked at everything He had made and found it very good" [Gn 1:31]. Material things cannot be made evil. Only persons and their actions can be evil, by putting last things first. Material things are among the last that matter in life, is this song turn off because they will not last. Knowing this truth and ordering one's choices according to it foster humility, disposing oneself to abiding more fully in God. Fr. George Mathew SCJ
