subject of the Kingdom of God.

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

On this Fifteenth Sunday in ordinary time Evangelist Matthew speaks about the Kingdom of God and its characteristics. Among the other synoptic Gospels, Matthew's Gospel gives special emphasis on this topic. What is Kingdom of God? How can we define Kingdom of God? A simple definition Kingdom of God can be, "Where God is in charge of everything and the subjects of His kingdom accepts His sovereignty and worship Him as their Lord and God; and the subjects live their life according to the commandments and live in their daily life the kingdom's values which are righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit". Matthew chapter five, six and seven speaks about the values of the kingdom of God and how one should live in the kingdom of God and especially the Sermon on the Mountain reaffirms this message. One interesting thing about the Kingdom of God is that the mysteries of the Kingdom of God is being revealed to mere children. Here children mean, the one who surrender himself/herself and accepts God's kingdom and its values with humility.

Today's Gospel speaks about the Parable of the Sower. This is the first parable that Jesus used to explain the Kingdom of God. Here, the Sower saw the seed in an open field. With only one intention of a hundred-fold produce. But the seeds fall into four specific areas in the field such as, on the path, among thorn bushes, on the rocky ground and on a good soil. From this parable we learn that the conditions must be right for God's Word to produce a harvest in our lives. The paths were packed down hard because of all the people walking on them. They were so hard that the seed being sown was unable to penetrate the soil and so they remained on top of the ground as easy picking for hungry birds. Jesus is referring to people whose hearts are so hard that the truth of His word cannot penetrate their lives. But a clever farmer can remedy this problem by ploughing them. The plow breaks up the hard ground so seeds will be able penetrate the soil. Just like those farmers some of us need to plough the soil of our hearts so that God's word can enter in. The next type of soil is the rocky ground, a shallow layer of soil on top of solid rock. It is important to understand that the real reason the plant dies is not because of the trial of the scorching sun, but because it doesn't have deep enough roots to deal with the trial. The seed has a natural capacity to resist the heat of the sun if they are rooted rightly. Therefore, the evil in the world is not the reason for our failure but our shallow root in God is inefficient to fight the evil. Just as sun is necessary for the growth of the plants, the challenges are necessary for our life. The one who deeply rooted in Christ, can withstand any challenges. The third type of soil that Jesus spoke of was thorny or weedy soil. The thorns grow up quickly and they choke out the plants. The weeds consume the water and nutrients that should be used for the plants nourishment and so they die. These thorns represent the cares of life and the desire for wealth and pleasures of the which choke the Word of God out of the lives of many people. The pursuit of worldly wealth consumes the energy that should be used in the pursuit of spiritual wealth, and we die spiritually. If you truly want to live a spiritually productive life then plow the soil and prepare your heart to receive God's word, put down roots and persevere through the trials of life, and pull the weeds of worldly wealth and pursue spiritual riches instead. If you do these things, then you will have good soil and the seed of God's word will produce a bountiful harvest in your life. That will make you a suitable
