Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Daniel 7:9-10.13-14;

Psalm 96;

2 Peter 1:16-19;

Matthew 17:1-9

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

"The experience of God's kingdom, taking flesh in our world, demands from us a bold, decisive and single-minded response." Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, imagine, if you were given a Cash Award of £20,000, for an extraordinary achievement, how would it make you feel? Of course, excited and happy! How are you going to spend it? Remember, you have full freedom to use it the way it pleases you. Perhaps, you could be puzzled, the way King Solomon was when God offered him an unlimited offer - to ask for anything he could dream of and it would be granted instantly. Solomon, inspired by the Spirit, sought wisdom to serve his people on the path of righteousness and justice. He asked the Lord, "Give therefore your servant wisdom and understanding" so that he will be able to discern good from evil. Yes friends, wealth did not attract him; power did not pursue him; fame did not fascinate him: it was his desire to serve, that powered Solomon to ask for wisdom and understanding. God said, "You have not asked Me for anything material, but I give you wealth and fame more than than you can imagine." In fact, history tells us that he was the wisest and the richest king that ever lived. In this incident, we realise that it was a perfect prayer on the part of Solomon. Solomon himself recognised that he was a child, he was unable to do anything just by himself and so he surrendered himself to God. At this attitude, at this disposition of Solomon, God decided to grant him all that he asked for. My dear friends, many a time we complain that we do not know how to pray, or our prayers are not answered. At this juncture, we remember what St. Paul wrote in his letter to the Romans. "It is the spirit who intercede for us, we do not know how we ought to pray. But it is the spirit who prays in us and through us".

In the second reading, St. Paul, again in his letter to the Romans, presents to us the plan of God, namely, justification and salvation, accomplished in the person of Jesus. God has called us, and those whom He has called, He has predestined to be transformed in the likeness of His son Jesus and to be glorified. Paul was absolutely certain of this divine plan. He emphatically states that no power, no force on earth, sin, suffering and death, can alter this. This fact gives us a sense of joy, a sense of hope, a sense of confidence. It is this attitude, it is this disposition, it is this approach that should be reflected in our day-to-day life. Because we have a reason to be happy, we have a reason to be joyful, we have a reason to be hopeful.

In the Gospel, we have three parables referring to the kingdom of God. In the first parable we have a treasure that a farmer finds, and he sacrifices everything to possess that treasure. We have a pearl of great value. The merchant sells all to purchase that pearl because he realises the greatness of the value of that pearl. Dear friends, what is our treasure? What is that great pearl of great value to us? It is nothing other than Jesus Himself. Jesus, His Gospel, His values are the Kingdom. These are values are that we want to possess, we want to cherish, we want to live by. And therefore, today we ask the Lord to help us to appreciate this great treasure, this great pearl of great value, so that they may become real treasures that we look for. May God bless all of us.
