WORLD MISSION SUNDAY.

This year World Mission Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday 22nd October. It is the one Sunday of the year when Mass is celebrated exclusively for Missionary activity. Donations collected at these worldwide Masses go in their entirety to support Churches, Hospitals, Schools and Vocations in countries where the church is new, young or poor. 'Missio' is the Pope's charity in England and Wales, and part of the International network of Pontifical societies, which oversees the distribution of resources equitably and justly on the basis of need. The money goes directly from the Bishops of England and Wales to the Bishops in the Mission Territories – Local churches directly helping Local churches!

17TH SEPTEMBER: EVANGELII GAUDIUM SUNDAY

Evangelii Gaudium Sunday calls us to be joyous in proclaiming our faith. "Evangelii Gaudium" is Latin for "Joy of the Gospel". The day supports the work carried out by the Mission Directorate on behalf of the Bishops' Conference. A key focus of work for the next few years is responding to Pope Francis' calling of a Jubilee Year in 2025 with the theme Pilgrims of Hope. The Holy Father has invited the whole Church to prepare for the Jubilee in the two years prior through: * Reflecting on the four Constitutions of the Second Vatican Council in 2023. *Deepening our prayer life, with a special focus on the Lord's Prayer, in 2024. To support the Church in England and Wales in this important initiative the Mission Directorate has produced a series of videos on the four Constitutions which reflect on the Liturgy, the Word of God, the Church and on its role in the modern world.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 55:6-9; Psalm 144; Philippians 1:20-24.27; Matthew 20:1-16 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today's Gospel reading directly follows Gospel of last Sunday in which Jesus taught the disciples how to handle disputes and conflict within the Christian community. This Sunday, we are invited to reflect on the virtue of forgiveness which Jesus preached in his ministry and lived in his life. Jesus portrays his heavenly Father as his model for compassion, graciousness, and mercy. It is to this life and mission we are invited by St Paul in the second reading of today, because 'whether we live or whether we die, we belong to the Lord'. Therefore, we live our Christian lives authentically as Jesus lived to become a transforming power in the society. How do I become a transforming power?

Firstly, see through a divine perspective as humans very often we look and perceive reality from a close distance. The close vision of ours will lead us to reach a situation where we often meet with the negatives: anger, resentment, unforgiveness, broken relationships, greed, poverty, murder, etc. To see the power and beauty of humans we need to have a divine perspective. Jesus himself says "I come from above and I want you to be reborn from above so that you will be able to see with new eyes". If we have a divine vision, we will better appreciate and be surprised even by a little flower that shows its beauty in the midst of barren desert. Secondly, forgive with a divine compassion. In today's reading Peter asks Jesus how many times one ought to extend forgiveness to another. Peter proposes a reasonable number of times, perhaps seven. Jesus replies by extending Peter's proposal by an enormous amount; not just seven times should one forgive, but 77 times. The parable of the unforgiving servant is Jesus' elaboration of his initial reply to Peter. Through the parable we come to understand the depths of God's mercy toward us and the results of our acceptance of God's forgiveness. The servant who could not pay back his debts of ten thousand was allowed to go home happily. Jesus forgave the soldiers and leaders while he hung on the cross. Heavenly Father allowed his son to shed even the last drop of his blood to save the sinful humanity. This is the mercy and compassion of the Lord. The question we must ask ourselves is: Do I possess a compassionate heart capable of such divine forgiveness? Last, share the Blessings we've Received: The servant who failed to extend the mercy he received from his master ended up in jail with his family. The rich man who ignored Lazarus found himself in Hades. These cautionary tales challenge us to emulate the mercy and compassion of the Lord in our interactions with fellow humans, share what you have received.

There is a temptation to quantify forgiveness as Peter tried to do, but Jesus' point is that forgiveness is not about quantity—the number of times we extend forgiveness to another. In the parable the king's forgiveness is like God's forgiveness, and it transforms us, helping us to be as forgiving as God. So dear Friends, let us view everything through the lens of love, making forgiveness our preferred response to wrongdoing. As Bryant McGill wisely noted, 'there is no love without forgiveness, and there is no forgiveness without love".
