'Missio' is the Pope's charity in England and Wales, and part of the International network of Pontifical societies, which oversees the distribution of resources equitably and justly on the basis of need. The money goes directly from the Bishops of England and Wales to the Bishops in the Mission Territories – Local churches directly helping Local churches!

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 5:1-7;
Psalm 79;
Philippians 4:6-9;
Matthew 21:33-43

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

This Gospel reading speaks volumes about what it means to be faithful to God. It's one thing to speak about what you intend on doing with your faith, but it's another thing to actually follow God's call, to act. In this parable, Jesus raises a simple yet profound point: Actively following God takes more of an effort than just claiming to follow him.

This story reminds us of the need to change: "The first son changed his mind and went". Jesus said to the chief priests and elders, "John came to you...you did not change your minds and believe him". The chief priests and elders resist Jesus, not because they are Jews, as some Christians might have us believe, but because they are secure in their positions as leaders. The more secure we are in our positions, the less likely we are to be open to the change Jesus asks of us. Also, the Gospel invites us to faith that is less about changelessness than about growth. One brother says yes and then does not go. Perhaps he says yes just to please his father, or because this is what people want him to say. The Gospel story shows us the nobility of a humble change of mind. The first son "thought the better of it." He was open to change, to better thoughts. The second son was set and closed. The ability to change one's mind is essential to all healthy relationships. A mind that is closed, whether from pride, stubbornness or stupidity, tends to destroy all relationships e.g., when we refuse to admit a mistake, when we are unwilling to apologise and change our ways, when we persist in prejudice against a person or group, when we think we know it all, we are withdrawing ourselves from positive change that could have helped us in our relationship God and with our brothers and sisters. Jesus began his own earthly ministry by proclaiming, "The Kingdom of God is near. Repent and believe the good news" (Mark 1:14-15). Repenting is making an about-face, turning 180 degrees. The first son in Jesus' story made his 180-degree turn, first refusing to do what was asked, and then going to do it. The tax collectors and prostitutes Jesus referred to make this 180-degree turn in repenting of the wrongs in their way of life, and they believed. Is repenting and responding in belief something that needs to happen only when we become a Christian? How can we rightly seek the kingdom of God first, in our life, daily, unless we repent of our wrongs, and reaffirm our faith, daily?

Do we profess our faith too soon? Do we expect people to say yes before they know what Jesus asks? Do we ask people to say yes to silly things for the time being, when Jesus invites us to a whole new way of life? Do some of us drop out of church because we find that Jesus is expecting more than we have thought of? Or perhaps because we take Jesus seriously but find that few other people in the church do? This story challenges us to promise less and do more...to be more thoughtful and serious about what we do promise. May our good Lod bless us to do his will always.
