#### Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Exodus 22:20-26; Psalm 17; 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10;

Matthew 22:34-40

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

On this World Mission Sunday, the readings point us the direction how to become a good citizen and a genuine disciple of Christ. "I am the Lord, there is no other." The prophet Isaiah tells us in simple, evocative words. God's power is universal, loving, and mysterious. All earthly powers come from God, as Isaiah reminds the Israelites. The context for the first reading is the Babylonian exile, which began in 587 B.C. when Jerusalem fell into the hands of Babylonians and forced the Jewish people into exile in Babylon. Many years later, in 539 B.C., Babylon fell to Cyrus of Persia, whose policies would prove that Cyrus will be Yahweh's instrument to set the Israelites free. It is interesting to note, that this is the only occasion in the Old Testament where Yahweh anoints a non-Jew. Being an invincible ruler of the ancient world, Cyrus did not worship Yahweh, yet he became instrumental to free the Jewish exiles and rebuilding of the Temple Jerusalem. This shows that God's plan of salvation is for the entire humanity, not just Israelites. Unless they know Yahweh, the humanity cannot be saved. Therefore, Yahweh chooses Cyrus as a way of revealing himself to people of all nations.

God's power has a profound meaning for our personal life. For when we trust that God is the source of all power, we place ourselves in the merciful hands of God, with confident faith and humble thanksgiving. It is this Christian attitude of thanksgiving and deep trust in God that Paul praises in today's second reading that the Thessalonians as an early Christian community whose faith, hope and love of Jesus Christ radiated from their words and actions. This was the path of Christian discipleship then and it remains the essence of every follower of Jesus today. The challenge of Sunday's Gospel lies in finding the balance between being disciples of Jesus Christ and being good citizens of society and the world. Jesus offers the religious leaders of his day an answer to this perennial task by answering their question with a question by saying, "Give to God what belongs to God." and "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar". Jesus confronts them, and us, with a fundamental question; do we give to God what rightfully belongs to our creator with our entire heart, mind and soul? Jesus's answer cuts right through the false dilemma of the Jewish leaders, to show that the Christian life is not an either/or situation. A disciple of Jesus strives to be both a law-abiding citizen and a person of faith who loves God and neighbour. Christian faith requires that we are good citizens, for Christians live in this world, but not of it. Followers of Jesus are often faced with difficult decisions. There are so many "Caesars" competing for our allegiance. As we give to "Caesar," God's word reminds us that we may never stop giving to God what belongs to God who is the origin and end, the meaning and purpose of existence. Doing our civil and social duties and duties to our family and friends, they are all considered to be the right way of giving what belongs to Caesar. At the same time, when we find a qualitative time for exercising our Christian charity through our daily actions and more importantly setting aside our prime time for personal prayer and reception of the sacraments and participation of the sacramental services of the church, we are giving what belong to God. The question I need to ask myself today is, "How does I respond to the challenge of Jesus, to be a good citizen and a good disciple of Christ at the same time?"
