STANDING ORDERS AND GIFT AID

We are most grateful to all those parishioners who give to the Church through a regular standing order and are able to gift aid their donation. This is a vital part of parish revenue. The cost of the running the parish has gone up significantly in the last 12 months, mainly driven by the increase in energy prices. These costs are likely to stay high for another 12 months due to the contracts we have in place via the Diocese. This has left a big hole in the funding of the parish expenses. For this reason, we are making a new appeal to all parishioner who currently don't have a standing order in place to think about setting one up. Further, if you are a taxpayer the parish can get an additional 25% on the donations you make with no cost to the donor by electing to gift aid the donation. If you are new to the parish, please have a think about doing this. On Sunday 10th of December someone will be outside church after each Mass with the necessary forms and to answer any questions you may have.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 40:1-5.9-11;
Psalm 84;
2 Peter 3:8-14;
Mark 1:1-8

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today we begin the new liturgical year with the season of Advent. It has been celebrated since around the fourth century AD when Christmas was fixed on 25 December replacing the pagan festival of the sun god. It has usually been marked by prayer and fasting, though less than in the lead-up to Easter, hence the popular name "Little Lent", as we can even see it in some of the eastern catholic churches' sill. Churches and priests were traditionally dressed up in penitential violet for these weeks and then decorated the churches, with wreathes and candles. The word advent comes from the Latin adventus, meaning 'coming' or 'arrival', and indicating a season of waiting. We sing hymns of longing like O Come, O come, Emmanuel. Yet Latin scholars such as any one of us! will immediately notice that the word adventus is in the past tense. It's as if the One we await has already arrived. Therefore, Advent points not to one but three comings of Christ. One coming is in the past, when Christ came two thousand years ago as a helpless Babe; hence the Prophet Isaiah named Him in our first reading today 'the ancient Redeemer' (Isa 63:16-17). Another coming is in the present when Christ is here amongst us in word and sacrament, in minister and community, in creation and redemption. The last coming is in the future, when Christ will return in glory; hence that same Prophet's prayer, "Return, O Lord, for the sake of your servants... tear open the heavens and come down."

That Christ has already come is something we know by faith: the more we ponder that coming in Advent and throughout the liturgical year, deepens its mystery and proclaims it to others in our words and deeds, the more faithful and faith-filled we become. That Christ will come again is something for which we hope, and the more we anticipate that coming with longing and excitement, the more we pray for it and help bring it about by making "God's kingdom come and will be done" in our lives, the more hopeful and hope-giving we will be. That Christ is here amongst us, evokes our love: and the more we know and serve Him in the here and now, the closer He comes to us, the more loving and lovely we become.

So, my dear brothers and sisters, Advent is about getting ready for our Lord to come. But it is also a reminder that he has already come. He has already entered into the reality of our human existence and he is still with us. Advent reminds us that Jesus is always arriving. In the people he sends into our lives. In the challenges we face every day. In the burdens we carry. Even in our sufferings. Advent reminds us that God is faithful! His love for us is true. He is all around us! He is with us. If we watch for him, if we stay alert, we will see his love everywhere around us. As we look backwards and forwards, do something spiritual, try some extra prayer, like Mass and Confession, or read and reflect our 'Walk with Me' booklets. Remember to prayer The Angelus each noontime. Try some fasting, perhaps in proportion to the feasting ahead or already begun. Teach carols and share the Christmas stories to your children. Remember that the One who has long came and is yet long to come, is also here right now come to your school to your office and at home near you! As we begin this journey toward the birth of our Saviour, let us stay close to his Mother Mary. May she help us this Advent to come to a new awareness of the presence of her Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in our lives! Fr. George Mathew SCJ
