Next Sunday's Mass Readings

2 Samuel 7:1-5. 8-12. 14. 16; Psalm 88; Romans 16:25-27; Luke 1:26-38 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

"Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Today, the third Sunday of Advent is called 'Gaudete Sunday' which means 'Joy' or Rejoice'. The opening antiphon for today's liturgy asks us to Rejoice is the Lord always; again I say rejoice. Indeed the Lord is near. Today, on our Advent Wreath we light our pink candle to mark this day of joy. As we gather today in the spirit of Advent preparing for Christmas, we are presented with the readings that will guide us in reflecting on the profound messages embedded in the Scriptures. All the three readings offering us a unique perspective on our Advent journey. In the first reading Prophet Isaiah declares, "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me..." These words resonate with the promise of a Saviour, a Redeemer who brings good news to the poor, binds up the broken-hearted, and proclaims liberty to the captives. As we prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth, let us recognize that this same Spirit anoints us today. We are called to bring hope, healing, and freedom to those in need. Reach out to someone in need especially during this Advent season. Your words of encouragement, acts of kindness, or simply offering a listening ear to someone may be the manifestation of the Spirit at work in you. In the second reading of today St Paul tells us to "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances." This concise yet profound guidance serves as a roadmap for our spiritual journey. As we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour, let us cultivate a spirit of constant communion with God through our prayers. Hence it is a reminder for us to put into practice daily and live with an attitude of gratitude and prayer. In the midst of our busy lives, let us carve out moments to rejoice in God's goodness, seek His guidance through prayer, and hold fast to the promise of His coming.

Finally in the Gospel of today, we encounter John the Baptist, a voice crying out in the wilderness, preparing the way for the Lord. The Advent season invites us to examine our hearts, to clear away the figurative "wilderness" that may be separating us from God. John's humility in recognizing his role as a witness to the Redeemer serves as an example for us. Let us point others to Christ as John the Baptist did and humbly prepare the way for His arrival in our hearts. You can follow John's example in your practical life by reflecting on areas in your life that may be a "wilderness" - places where distractions or sins may hinder your relationship with God. You can prepare a path for the Lord to enter fully into your life through prayer, confession, and repentance. In conclusion, as we journey through Advent, let us heed the call to rejoice, pray, and prepare. The Spirit of the Lord is upon us, empowering us to bring hope and healing. May we, like John the Baptist, be voices crying out in the wilderness, preparing the way for the Lord's coming. As we embrace these practical applications, may our hearts be filled with joy, our prayers be constant, and our lives be a testimony to the transformative power of Christ. May God bless us with his Joy.
