Next Sunday's Mass Readings Genesis 15;1-6; 21:1-3; Psalm 104; Hebrews 11:8.11-12.17-19; Luke 2:22-40 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today we celebrate Fourth Sunday of Advent. This evening we will join to celebrate the coming of the Light of God into the world. On Christmas we celebrate the coming of Jesus in the world. Maybe more than any other time of the year, we feel God's closeness to us for it seems to be easier to open our hearts to Him. And so, today's gospel presents Mary and her initiation to the first Christmas. Seeing her faith during the annunciation, this helps us to prepare properly for Christmas. Our Gospel today takes us to the home of the teenager, Mary in Nazareth. Gabriel, the messenger from God, asks her a favour-even in her fear, she is willing to take a risk.

A simple "YES" from a young Jewish peasant girl changed our history. Our "YES" can make a real difference today and change your history or the life of another; our generous response can change lives for the better. Our faith and trust can be one of the best Christmas gifts we give to today: let us tell our family and friends how much they mean to us! Our "YES" to Christmas 2023 will impact others in ways that you will probably never be aware of-so, thank you! The Good News in today's Scripture message is not only that God is making provision for the His people, but also that He has a plan for each individual person. Just as God called Mary, we too are called to move forward with unconditional love and guidance. In many cases, our work for God seems rather ordinary, but each ordinary task which we carry out fits into God's plan in ways that we perhaps cannot fully understand. God desires not the skill of our hands and talents alone, but the love of our hearts. The Babe in the Manger reminds us of what God has done and is still doing for us. What are we doing in return? Let us show our gratitude to God by living as true followers of Christ.

It is Mary's faith that makes the incarnation possible. And it is our faith that makes the incarnation possible in our own world. We can bring the Child to the world in our daily and simple interaction with others; Incarnation brings new meaning to our families, to grow with us, to be with us. And it is through the goodness of our own faith, one with him, that the love of God is to be radiated out into the whole world. The faith of that Holy Family shows that we are invited to be fully involved: our faith is something that we live fully, not just for a couple of hours on a Sunday. We are called to share the compassion of Jesus with those we meet today. Even though it is going to be different this year, friends and family will still need help-washing up support in the kitchen will be very much appreciated. As Pope Francis reminds us Mary can help us deepen our faith and share it with others. God bless us.
