## Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Jonah 3:1-5.10;

Psalm 24;

1 Corinthians

7:29-31;

Mark 1:14-20

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

On this second Sunday of ordinary time, we hear the voice of God louder as always, inviting us to be his disciples. Today, the Holy Mother Church, reminds us that God's call is real and that, God knows and calls us personally by our names. Thus, she encourages us to respond effectively to this call with our body, soul and spirit. Our first reading from the first book of Samuel describes the dramatic call of Samuel. In fact, it reminds us of our own call. Many times, I have been asked, how does God speak to one? How can I respond to God's call? These are very genuine questions which reflect our puzzlements as we see in the young Samuel today. We live in a very noisy world, yet we can still hear God speaking to us. That is, if only we can discipline ourselves against both spiritual and worldly noise. Life is full of God's voice. As a father, He speaks to us through various people, events and circumstances of everyday life. Like Samuel, we must always be ready to say: "Speak Lord, for your servant is listening." However, the only problem is that most times, we cannot hear him, especially the time we let ourselves engulfed in the noises of the world. So, we need to be always disposed to listen to God. The question is, when was the last time we spent up to ten minutes in silence in His presence? We cannot hear Him if we are the one doing all the talking all the time. To listen to Him speaking to us we need to discipline our mind and body.

This is what St. Paul speaking to us in the second reading. This reading can be called as "Paul's moral theology." This is because it touches a very important moral issue that has almost defiled solutions in our modern society. In fact, it keeps developing more tentacles as the day passes by. St. Paul simply narrowed down the to sin of the flesh. Of what relevance is this to responding to God's call? This vice is a sin against our body as well as against the Spirit of God who lives in us. Hence, Paul reminds us: "Your bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you since you received him from God." Sin of the flesh slows down one's spiritual and moral growth. Consequently, it slows down the ability to respond effectively to God's call. Through this, Paul draws our attention to the relationship between morality and spirituality. The spiritual is affected by the physical. When both our spiritual and physical life affected negatively our whole self loses its right balance. Also, Paul reminds us that we completely belong to God. Preserving ourselves for God, is a very important way of responding to his call. It a way of offering ourselves totally to God as, "a living and pure sacrifice" (Rom 12: 1).

In the Gospel we see after hearing the testimony of John, the first disciples had sufficient reason to follow Jesus. The experience of staying with Jesus had changed their life. As they experienced Jesus, they introduced many people to Jesus. Through history, people have come to Jesus for various reasons. People still come to Jesus for varying reasons. Indeed, a true and honest encounter with God can be life changing. An encounter with God turned the little boy, Samuel into one of Israel's greatest prophets. An encounter with God turned a fisherman into a rock on which the Church has stood for over 2000 years. An encounter with God turned a zealous Pharisee named Saul into the assiduous apostle and preacher, Paul. We too have been invited to come and see, to come and have an encounter with God as we hear the priest repeat the same words of John the Baptist at mass each day "Behold the Lamb". Let us continue to ask the Lord to give us the grace to listen to Him so that we can experience him.
