### **COLLETES HEDERAE**

Late summer and early Autumn, walking past the SCJ Community graves, you may have noticed several hundred small, striped bees busily hovering among the grasses. Colletes hederae, the Ivy Mining bee is a useful late pollinator of such plants as ivy, which flower late in the year, providing food for late-flying insects and berries through the winter for birds and small mammals.

For all that in early Autumn, the bees gather in large numbers, they are actually solitary in habit and overwinter in separate holes in the ground within that area where we observe them preparing for winter.

Worcestershire Wildlife Trust were pleased to have been notified of the presence of Colletes hederae on our site. Just for interest.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings Job 7:1-4.6-7; Psalm 146; 1 Corinthians 9:16-19.22-23; Mark 1:29-39 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today readings reminds us our baptism and the mission entrusted to us at the Baptism. Every baptised Christian, by virtue of his or her baptism, is called to be a prophet, one of the threefold mission of Christ-Priest, Prophet and king. I this twenty first century prophet is not just a large, dramatic figures such as Moses. Nor is it limited to the mystic past, as in ancient Israel. Each one of us are called to be a prophet in the midst of our ordinary life. But what is our prophetic mission? At Baptism we I hear the threefold description in our call to holiness. After the Baptism comes the anointing with sacred chrism oil, wherein the priest or deacon prays these words: "As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life". This anointing is a stirring reminder of the sublime dignity conferred on us. This is a call to embrace these shared offices of Christ as priest, prophet, and king. In the ministerial priesthood, these are fulfilled by preaching and teaching and in governance of the Church. How might the laity live these prophetic offices? Vatican II described the lay vocation this way: "It belongs to the laity to seek the kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and directing them according to God's will ... so to illuminate and order all temporal things with which they are closely associated that these may always be effected and grow according to Christ and may be to the glory of the Creator and Redeemer" (CCC, 898).

With faith and the grace of the sacraments, we must bring Christ to our families, societies, and the wider culture. The faithful are sent out from Mass to go and serve Christ wherever life takes them. This is a prophetic mission. They are very much in the front lines for Christianity, to consecrate the world, to make it holy. This understanding was expressed by Pope Pius XII and later echoed by St. John Paul II: "Lay believers are in the front line of Church life; for them the Church is the animating principle of human society. Therefore, they in particular ought to have an ever-clearer consciousness not only of belonging to the Church, but of being the Church" (CCC, 899). The laity act prophetically when they speak the truth, and live the Gospel by example before their families, neighbours, and co-workers. Their mission is "accomplished in the ordinary circumstances of the world" (CCC, 905). This is a noble and sublime responsibility that we are entrusted with. In a single word, the prophet calls God's People to integrity. The prophet sets before God's People the truth that their lives today must reflect the promises they made to God in the past so that they can enjoy God's Presence in the future. In The Gospel reading we see this reflected in the mission of Jesus, that He taught with authority. Having never expected anything like this, most people had no idea how to respond. Some were frightened, others threatened. But to those who would follow him, Jesus offered an amazing new take on life. He rooted his message in their traditions, yet, rather than close the book saying, "That's all folks!" Jesus spurred them to hope that all the promises of old would come true - in ways so new that they would continually be astounded. Our prophetic mission leads us to hope that we share the mission of Christ and thus we become an extension of Christ's mission on earth. God bless you all.
