SACRED HEART SUMMER FAIR

NEW LECTIONARY

The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts. The new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter for the psalms. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, to reflect current biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in liturgical setting that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. All through the year a set of 4 volumes used the total cost will be £960 including book of the Gospel. If you would like to sponsor a volume or more in remembrance of your loved one or to mark a significate event like anniversaries of Jubilees etc your name will be inscribed on the Donor Bookplate in the Lectionary. A single volume cost £192. Please let us know if you can sponsor a Lectionary for the church. The standard edition of the new Sunday missal for the people's use can be ordered. Hard back missal cost 19.95 there is 15% reduction for preorders.

CAR PARK DEVELOPMENT

Finally, twelve years after Planning Permission was granted, most of the car park at the back of the church is being sold for housing. The building work is likely to start in the autumn. Once the houses are built there will only be 66 spaces for the use of parishioners and hall users. But, during the build, this number will be reduced, inevitably leading to issues. When further details are available, ncluding how the issues will be managed, these will be communicated.

MARYVALE INSTITUTE

We are delighted to share with you exciting new developments at Maryvale Institute. In a new venture agreed between the Archdiocese and St Mary's University, Twickenham, (SMU) three of Maryvale's programmes (recently validated by the Open University and Liverpool Hope University) will move to a new 'Maryvale at St Mary's'. Maryvale Higher Institute of Religious Sciences (HIRS), the first of its kind in the English-speaking world, will remain, serving the Archdiocese and the wider Church. Two flourishing Maryvale programmes, the Bachelor of Divinity and Licence in Catechetics degrees are recruiting for the academic year 2024-25. Demand for all Maryvale programmes has been strong and ahead of expectations. Maryvale HIRS is also developing a closer relationship with St Mary's College, Oscott, the inter-diocesan Seminary based within the Archdiocese. Current plans envisage sharing Oscott's IT platform and facilities and holding face-to-face teaching there, as well as exams and graduations.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Ezekiel 2:2-5;
Psalm 122;
2 Corinthians 12:7-10;
Mark 6:1-6

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today we celebrate the solemnity of Peter and Paul, the two great pilers of the Church. The confession of St. Peter comes at the very centre of the Gospel of Matthew. The story of Peter and Paul tell us that it's possible to change our ways for Christ. Paul was a staunch Jew and pharisee who persecuted Christians, but then he had a conversion. Peter had denied Jesus three times, yet he repented and became the first Vicar of Christ.

The seen of today's Gospel set on Caesarea Philippi a pagan city where number of Greek and pagan gods were worshiped and a shrine dedicated to Pan and related deities on the southwestern slop of Mount Hermon the site of an ancient spring in northern Israel. The Romans later conquered the area and Herod Philip rebuilt the city, naming it after himself and Caesar.

Why did Jesus bring his disciples to this pagan city? Firstly, Jesus took them away from Jewish city, that he wants his disciples to answer his question without the fear of Jews. Secondly, he brough them to this pagan city where several deities were worshiped, that Jesus wanted to know what disciples think about him, if he is just one among those pagan gods or somebody different. The first question he asked them was "who do people say I am". Since it was not a difficult question, disciples answered brilliantly. Then comes the second question; "who do 'You' say I am"? After a very long pause, Peter said, "You are the Christ, the son of the living God". It was Peter's true profession of faith, came straight from his personal experience of Jesus. He makes this profession of faith in front of several lifeless deities made of metal and stone. This question changed the course of their life. Just like the disciples, the answer to this question determines our understanding of Jesus. After two thousand years, still the same question resounds in our ears "who do 'You' say I am"? what we believe that influence our entire life. It is not enough to believe something here and there. But a right understanding of Christ is indispensable for true Christian way of life. "Therefore, believing and preaching the true faith in Jesus is very important. St. Paul says, "If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed" (Galatians 1:9)

What is that True Faith professed by Peter? 1: You are 'The Son of the living God'. Not a lifeless deity who cannot have influence on us. but 'a Living God' who is fully alive in us, a God who knows us completely, the one who interferes in our problems. 2: You are 'The Son of God': God from God, light from light, true God from true God, begotten not made, consubstantial with the Father, through him all things were made. 3: You are 'The Christ': Christ means 'Messiah or Anointed one', the one whom the humanity waited for centuries. This is the perfect utterance and core of Christian Faith. This should be our faith too nothing else. For Jesus says, "For you will die in your sins unless you believe that I am He" (John 8: 24) In this story we hear Jesus giving Peter a second chance. Jesus asks him, 'Do you love me?' And three times Peter assures him he does. He joins Paul in Rome. They both devote the rest of their lives to telling people who Jesus was and so it was that the Catholic Church took root in Europe. From Europe, it spread to every continent of the world. We're here today, celebrating the Eucharist, because they had the courage to tell people who Jesus was. By dying in the heroic way they did, they gave the most powerful witness to their belief in Christ. Fr. George Mathew SCJ
