#### SACRED HEART SUMMER FAIR

#### **NEW LECTIONARY**

The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts. The new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter for the psalms. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, to reflect current biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in liturgical setting that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. All through the year a set of 4 volumes used the total cost will be £960 including book of the Gospel. If you would like to sponsor a volume or more in remembrance of your loved one or to mark a significate event like anniversaries of Jubilees etc your name will be inscribed on the Donor Bookplate in the Lectionary. A single volume cost £192. Please let us know if you can sponsor a Lectionary for the church. The standard edition of the new Sunday missal for the people's use can be ordered. Hard back missal cost 19.95 there is 10% reduction for preorders.

## Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Amos 7:12-15;

Psalm 84;

Ephesians 1:3-14;

Mark 6:7-13

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

On this Fourteenth Sunday of the Ordinary Season, the readings invite us to focus our attention to three important points. The Call to be God's prophets; The Rejection that we will have to face as Christian; and finally, the importance of recognizing our prophetic role. At first glance, the readings remind us about our Call to be prophets. In the first reading God calls Ezekiel to be a prophet to the rebellious Israelites. Like any other prophet, he too was not well accepted by the people.

St. Paul in today's second reading describes his own personal sufferings as "a thorn in the flesh", in his ministry. Despite his plea for its removal, God's response was, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Like Ezekiel and Paul, every one of us is entrusted with this mission of proclaiming God's truth, sharing His love, and living out the Gospel in our daily lives. The Gospel reading from MARK warns us that we will face scepticism and rejection from our own people, just as Jesus was rejected in His own village. Instead of rejoicing and accepting Jesus as the God-sent Saviour and Messiah, they found fault with Him and "took offence at Him." "Where did this man get these things? The saying, "Familiarity breeds contempt," is so true in this case, and they fail to recognise the divine presence in His words and actions. This is a powerful reminder that as we carry out our prophetic mission, we too will face scepticism, cynicism, and rejection. If we look closely into our society and the world at large, we can clearly see this unhinged cynicism, and rejection towards Christianity and Christ.

Unlike towards any other religions, church and Christianity has been disproportionately targeted over the century. It is true that church is made of imperfect people and so it is inevitable that unholy actions could be seen in the church because of those imperfect persons. But the amount of contempt and scorn towards Christ and his Church is way beyond the amount of imperfections in the church. This unjustifiable contempt and scorn towards Christ and his Church are a huge block for many people to know and experience Christ and his message. This is what Jesus warns his followers. In such moments, Jesus says, "Be of good courage, for I have conquered the world." Pope Francis also encourages us, in Christus Vivit, No. 64, saying, "Do not be afraid to set your sights higher, to allow yourself to be loved and liberated by God. Do not be afraid to let yourselves be guided by the Holy Spirit." In the face of adversity, we must remain steadfast in our mission like Jesus, trusting in God's grace and guidance. The readings highlight the necessity of recognizing God's presence in the people around us, in their commitment, goodness, truthfulness, justice, and leadership. The people of Nazareth could not see beyond Jesus' humble origins. Their lack of faith astonished Jesus, and He could not perform many miracles because of their unbelief. They missed God's visitation among them and marvellous works for them. We too are called to look beyond our differences to see the potential in everyone. God bless us.
