NEW LECTIONARY

The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The process began with the Roman Missal in 2011 and has continued with all the other liturgical texts. The new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version Catholic Edition of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter for the psalms. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, to reflect current biblical scholarship, and to provide a text for use in liturgical setting that is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. All through the year a set of 4 volumes is used. The total cost will be £960 including book of the Gospel. Thank you to all who have sponsored the Lectionary for the Church. The standard edition of the new Sunday missal for the people's use can be ordered. Hard back missals cost £19.95 but there is 10% reduction for preorders.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Proverbs 9:1-6;
Psalm 33;
Ephesians 5:15-20;
John 6:51-58

On this Sunday, we continue to read from the "Bread of Life discourse" found in the sixth chapter of John's Gospel. Recall that we have been reading from this chapter for the past two weeks and will continue to read from it for another two. In the first reading we see how God's invisible hand always at works in our life especially in time when we feel we are done. Elijah's experience here is so raw. We're told that after fleeing to the desert, he wished and prayed for his life to end. Like Elijah we give up, we give in, and we accept defeat when the road ahead gets tough and the going steep. When trials come our way, we prefer to regard them as hindrances and obstacles rather than as opportunities. One of the reasons why this happens is because we do not trust ourselves and God enough. We set limits on what God can and cannot do. We decide in advance the form that his manifestation will take and, when this does not happen, we conclude that he is not present. So many people in our world today struggle with feelings of abandonment, or extreme poverty, or circumstances that lead them to despair. This passage shows that God understands and encourages us to be open enough to share that with him. Here we notice how easily the angel of the Lord slips into the narrative; the unseen aspect of creation is just as real and tangible in the biblical worldview as the seen. How does that challenge us? God's compassionate care for his people reaches into the darkest of circumstances, there is always hope. God does not give up on us and He believes in us.

In the Gospel we see Jesus speaking about the bread of life. The bread that the angel gave sustained Elijah and enables him to continue on his way along the path that he has chosen and reassured that this bread that will give him the strength that he requires to persevere in what God wants him to do. Elijah accepts the bread and is able to go on. This bread, however, pales in comparison to the bread that Jesus gives to anyone who is willing to believe. However, the people in the Gospel text of today were not willing to do so. They had made up their minds that God could not come to them in the ordinary and mundane form of bread. They had decided that God would only come in glory, power, and might and, that when he came, he would rule and not serve. They were confident that God could come only in the spectacular, the extra- ordinary, and the miraculous. This is why they simply cannot believe that Jesus could be the Messiah. They thought they knew Him so He cannot be the Messiah. They, too, like Elijah, set limits on what God could do.

However, unlike Elijah, the crowd who listened to Jesus did not relent and so remained in their scepticism. This is what St. Paul in the second reading of today, exhorts not to grieve the Holy Spirit. The sin against the Holy Spirit is to disbelieve and refuse to accept the fact that Jesus has been offered up to God, that he even offered himself up, so that others might have life in all its fullness. Since believers have been transformed into Christ, they must live that new life. At the same time, they must be actively engaged in strengthening what they already are. This is why when we, like Elijah, are tempted to say "enough" because we have had more than our share of trials and tribulations and when we, like the crowd who encountered Jesus, are tempted to disbelieve because we cannot see as we think we must, he keeps reminding us that he is there and will be our bread for the journey. He keeps reminding us that, with him in us, we need never fear, we need never give up and, we need never despair. It is a message that will keep resonating in our hearts when we partake of the bread that he gives. It is a message that will resonate in out hearts when we dare, in our own way, to become bread for others.
