Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Jeremiah 31:7-9; Psalm 125; Hebrews 5:1-6; Mark 10:46-52 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

In the gospel taken from Mark we have James and John requesting Jesus for seats of power. In doing so, the sons of Zebedee seem to have missed everything Jesus had said and done. They were expecting a political and spiritual battle while being loyal to Jesus, ready to stand with Hm. They do not yet realise that His way is not the way of status or entitlement and that their call as disciples and as leaders of the new community has nothing to do with privileges. It has more to do with enduring the suffering associated with commitment to their mission and with setting others free to be their best selves.

Responding to His disciples, Jesus draws their attention to the Roman authorities who regularly "overpower" and "intimidate" others. They rely on coercion and control to maintain their dominance and privileges. In absolute contrast, greatness among Jesus' followers is counter-cultural. It is measured by their ability to live as servants, even if that life means suffering oppression at the hands of those who wield power. To demonstrate this, Jesus offers an unpalatable alternative: 'to be slave of all'. He sustains the slavery metaphor and goes on to summarise his own mission with an image that comes out of the world of his time: 'not to be served but to serve and give life as a ransom for many'. The 'ransom' was the payment made to free someone from slavery or captivity. To substitute oneself for a slave was to give one's life as a ransom for that slave. Reading the gospel from beginning to end helps us to understand the ultimate self-giving of Jesus in death as the climax of a lifetime's outpouring of love, a love that draws forth loving and liberating action in others.

Jesus has a unique role in the plan of salvation. He draws on two metaphors that James and John would have understood too well: He says, "Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" In the Old Testament, "cup" often refers to blessings, judgment or death. While James and John are thinking of the cup and baptism as wonderful blessings, Jesus knows that they will involve pain, sacrifice and death. One may ask - Why should we follow the way of Jesus? It eventually led one to death on the cross? What we see in our world today, is precisely the upshot of not following the teachings of Jesus. Problems are attempted to be solved through strength and force, extremism and radicalism and the result is that the world is on the brink of a Third World War. Power struggles and upheavals are nothing out of the ordinary now. However, it is very clear that this is not the way to deal the problems we face in the world. Because this mode of resolving the problem will only breed more violence, revenge and a chain of vengeance one after the other, somebody has to break this chain of vengeance! It's only love and forgiveness that can solve problems and bring reconciliation. Being a Christian is not about reaping rich rewards. Instead, it is about total obedience to the will of God and humbling oneself. I will conclude with a quotation of St. Theresa of Kolkata, "The fruit of silence is prayer; the fruit of prayer is faith; the fruit of faith is love; the fruit of love is service; the fruit of service is peace." This peace is what today's world desperately in need of. So, let us pray for peace in the world.
