Amos 6:1a,4-7
Psalm 145(146);
1 Timothy 6:11b-16

Luke 16:19-31

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

We are living in a new world, where powerful and influential people and governments dictate the fate of the rest of the world. The modern economic system, designed by powerful businesspeople, and the subsequent governments and political system, which are the beneficiaries of this new world order, write the terms and conditions for the rest of the world. It wasn't much different in the time of prophet Amos during the reign of Jeroboam II in the northern kingdom of Israel, around 760 BC. The northern kingdom of Israel under the reign of Jeroboam II experienced the peak of its prosperity and glory outwardly, but deep beneath the surface there was inequality, injustice and distress among the people. The wealthy elites grew richer while the poor were squashed and ignored. The prophet condemns those who exploit the weak, especially the businessmen who are impatient for Sabbath to end so they can return to making profits. Amos warns that God sees these actions and "will never forget" the injustice done to His people. The heart of Amos's message is that worship and rituals mean nothing if they are not accompanied by justice and ethics. To oppress the poor while pretending to honour God is hypocrisy. This passage speaks powerfully to our own time too.

A businessman who heads his own company interviewed three applicants for a job. As a test he asks: "If you divide six by two, what's the result?" "Three," answered the first applicant. He was not hired for being too honest. "Two," answered the second applicant. Again, he was not hired because he was dishonest and for being an ignorant fool. The third applicant answered, "Sir, if I were to divide six between you and me, I would rather give you four and take two myself". He was hired for being clever. In the Gospel Jesus speaks about stewardship. Jesus was not a global economist or even a private financial adviser, but He did have a bit to say about Christian economics. He clearly thought money can indeed be used well, in support of good works both spiritual and mundane, and He praised voluntary charity, paying just taxes, investing wisely as well as generously forgiving debts. If he and his followers were to be "good news to the poor", they had to be both willing and able to do something for them. They required both the means and the good motive to be stewards in the household of God and Good Samaritans in the world.

St. Teresa of Avila was once criticised for being too worldly: a true saint, her critics suggested, would have no need of money. Teresa, being a practical woman, responded with Spanish humour, "With God I can do much; with God and money, I can do even more!". Not that she was licensing materialism and selfishness or preaching the ideology of unbridled capitalism and consumerism. No, this eminently practical and deeply spiritual women knew well the temptations of the human spirit. Money has its uses, but money alone will not make us a saint. Jesus concludes his parable with a lesson on what controls or rules our lives. Who is the master in charge of our life? Our master is that which governs our though-life, shapes our ideals and controls the desire of the heart and the values we choose to live by. Many different things can rule us, the love of money or possessions, power or position, the glamour of wealth and prestige, the driving force of unruly passions and addictions. Ultimately the choice boils down to two: God and Mammon. There is one Master alone who has the power to set us free from the slavery of sin and spiritual degradation. The Master is the Lord Jesus Christ. God bless us.
