Next Sunday's
Mass Readings
2 Kings 5:14-17
Psalm 98(97);
2 Timothy 2:8-13
Luke 17:11-19

The Readings on this Sunday reminds us to trust God, even when life feels unfair or unclear. The readings speak of faith that waits with hope, worship that listens, and service that does what is needed. The first reading is taken from the prophet Habkkuk, who lived in Judah around the late 7th century BC, a time when Babylon was rising in power and would soon invade Judah. People were suffering, leaders were corrupt, and violence seemed to go unchecked. Amidist of this fear uncertainty Habakkuk speaks to God from his heart. He is troubled because the wicked appear to prosper while the innocent suffer. He cannot understand why a just God allows evil to continue. His words sound very much like the questions we ask today when we see war, corruption and pain in our own world. God's answer, however, is unexpected: He tells: "The righteous shall live by faith". that God's justice will come and that evil will not win forever. A father once lost his job unexpectedly and was anxious about how he would provide for his family. Each day he worried about rent, school fees and food on the table. One evening his little daughter noticed his troubled face and said, "Dady, let's just pray for today's bread. Tomorrow we can pray again". Her simple trust struck him. He didn't need to solve every problem at once; he only needed to trust God for today. In the same way, the disciples in today's Gospel ask Jesus, "Increase our faith!" They think they need a bigger faith to follow Him faithfully. But Jesus tells them that even faith as small as a mustard seed a tiny seed barely visible can uproot a tree and plant it in the sea.

So, what is this little faith? The classical definition of faith is, "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things unseen" (Hebrews 11:1). When someone judges something to be true either because it is evident to their senses or because it is evident to their reason, the judgment is not a matter of faith. It is a matter of knowing these things. However, one believes something not because it is evident to one's own senses or reason, but because someone else sees it and testifies to it. Believing something on the word or testimony of another person is called faith. Faith, then, is not a case of believing something without any evidence or reason at all, but a case of believing something with another kind of evidence besides one's own senses or reason. The articles of our faith cannot be completely verified and scrutinised in a science laboratory. We need a certain amount of faith to believe even the scientific discoveries. The scientists have discovered the existence of black holes in the universe which has such extreme gravity that not even light can escape from within their event horizon. We believe this not that we ourselves have seen and testified it, but we trust the testimony of the scientists. In fact, human beings will take tremendous risks on the faith we have in one another. All these shows just how crucial faith is to human life. Faith is a natural and inescapable part of life, and without it neither individuals nor societies could function. Now what does all of this have to do with Christian faith? What we have been discussing so far is human faith, the faith that human beings naturally and ordinarily have in each other's testimony. But from the earliest days, Christians saw a comparison between that natural and ordinary human faith and the supernatural gift of faith in God and Jesus Christ. We see in the first letter of John: "If we believe the word of men, how much greater is the word of God". In other words, if it is a reasonable thing for human beings to have faith in the word of merely human witnesses even though humans are fallible and often mistaken, how much more reasonable is it for us to have faith in the word of God who is infallible and cannot either deceive or be deceived. In the First Letter to the Thessalonians, St. Paul shows how conscious the early Christians were of believing not only human testimony, but divine testimony the Word of God. So, too, it should be with us. What we believe by faith is not merely human testimony, but the Word of the Living God. Christian faith is not born from merely rational reflection upon evidence or signs. It is a gift of God born from the Spirit of truth at work within our souls and illuminating everything. The Spirit moves us, in coordination with the whole Church, to believe everything that God has revealed. God bless us.
