Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Revelation 7:2-4,9-14 Psalm 24(23); John 3:1-3 Matthew 5:1-12a My dear friends in Jesus Christ. Today's readings remind us that God listens not to the proud, but to the humble. The first reading is taken from the Book of Sirach which was written during the Second Temple period, a time in Jewish history around 200 BC when Jewish society was significantly influenced by Hellenistic culture and ideas, and many Jews wondered how to remain faithful to God. It was a time when many people believed that wealth and offerings could win God's favour. The author of the Book of Sirach wanted to offer practical wisdom, long rooted in Israel's tradition, showing people that God is impartial and not influenced by wealth or power. Ben Sira, a Hellenistic Jewish scribe, boldly proclaimed that God cannot be bribed. He is a God of justice, one who listens especially to the poor, the orphan and the widow. When we cry out to Him in pain, confusion or loneliness, He listens. He may seem silent for a while, but Sirach assures us that God "will not delay". Justice may take time, but it will come.

Have you ever found yourself saying or doing something that felt so out of place, so deeply wrong that you knew that you might regret it for a lifetime? You might begin to ask yourself, "My God, why did I say that?" But, despite this awful feeling, I think we must thank God that our conscience is still capable of arousing that feeling of self-reproach. It's a mirror revealing to us our inner self which offers a glimpse into who we truly are deep within us and who we are called to become. In the Gospel of Luke chapter 18, Jesus is presenting before us a Pharisee and a publican. The Pharisee is confident in himself, in his righteous deeds, fasting, tithing and a sense of superiority that he had. The tax collector on the other hand, broken and humble, cries out, "God, be merciful to me as a sinner". At the end of the parable Jesus says, "The humble tax collector went home justified, reconciled and peaceful, but not the Pharisee". The key point of the parable is that we are made right before God not by our works alone, but by relying on his mercy. Fasting, tithing, these are all good deeds; we ought to do them. But at the end of the day what wins God's favour is loving trust in Him.

What does it mean by trusting in God? And how can we place our trust in God and find peace at the end of the day? Trusting in God means knowledge, faith and trust. Our knowledge of God leads to faith, faith leads to trust and ultimately trust results in inner peace. Putting our trust in God is to have the right knowledge of God. This does not mean that we should know everything about God, but the knowledge of Him, which He permits us to have, is that which is essential for our salvation. First of all, He is all powerful, all good and He is all loving. This knowledge is important for us to be able to believe in Him. Secondly He is all good. There is no shadow of darkness in Him. Thirdly, God loves us unconditionally. Finally, He is all wise. He knows what is best for us. This is not merely an intellectual knowledge but is revealed through the scriptures and particularly by Jesus Christ. If we seek this knowledge diligently through prayer, study, reflection, then it will provide for us the foundation for our faith in Him which is the core of our being that could finally lead us to trust in God. Trust is the active reliance and personal commitment that grows from faith. Trust is the practical outworking of faith. It is a decision to rely on God. The publican's simple prayer was, "God, be merciful to me a sinner". That presupposes all these four pillars. Faith in God's power, his goodness, his love and wisdom. His inner self was aligned with God. He made this act of trust by saying, "God be merciful to me a sinner", and with this he was able to go down to his house comforted. When we come to God, my dear brothers and sisters, we must come with this confidence, the God to whom we are going is powerful, is good, loving and wise. It is enough just to say, "Lord, I trust in You". Commit yourself in all humility to Him. You will find peace.
