NEWMAN TO BE DECLARED A DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH 1ST NOVEMBER 2025

On 1 November, the Feast of All Saints, Pope Leo will proclaim Saint John Henry Newman a Doctor of the Universal Church. He said, "I will confer the title of Doctor of the Church on Saint John Henry Newman, who gave a decisive contribution to the renewal of theology and to understanding Christian doctrine in its development, in the context of the Jubilee of the World of Education". Newman will become the 38th Doctor of the Church and only the third Englishman. Saint John Henry Newman is especially remarkable for the breadth of his teaching across many aspects of the Catholic faith. It is also of particular ecumenical significance in that his extensive body of writings, first as an Anglican and then as a Roman Catholic, has been examined and found to be a true expression of the faith of the Church.

DEANERY DAY OF PRAY FOR VOCATIONS

The Kidderminster and Worcester Deanery keep a day of prayer for Vocation to the Priesthood, Religious Life and Diaconate ministries on Wednesday the 5th November 2025. We are privileged to host the day here at Sacred Heart Church. The day will begin with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in Our Lady's chapel as we usually do on Wednesdays from 10 am till 6pm. 2 Maccabees

From the very beginning until today, Christians have been struggling to cultivate lives centred on Christ and His teachings. In a world dominated by the popular media culture that drags people into its superficial clamour, it is necessary to find examples of Christians who spent their lives pursuing true values and to learn from their example. Jacques Maritain and his wife Raissa were prominent French Catholic intellectuals in the early 20th century. In 1901 as students grappling with the nihilism of the era's philosophies, the couple made a suicide pact that, unless they could discover by the end of the school year the true meaning of life, they would end their own lives. While they were waiting for the school year to come to an end, Jacques happened to read a statement by Leon Bloy, a French Catholic novelist, who said, "My only real sadness in life is not to become a saint", and that had a huge impact on young Jacques and Raissa's life. After entering the Catholic Church their lives were not free from trials—sickness, war and loss plagued them throughout their lives. But their faith gave these trials meaning and purpose, and so it carried them through these difficulties.

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ, today the church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints, a feast radiant with joy and hope. It is a day to honour not only the canonized saints known to the church but also the countless holy men and women who lived faithfully, quietly and humbly in the light of Christ. Who are the saints? The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that "The saints are those who have practised heroic virtue and lived in fidelity to God's grace". They are ordinary human beings who allowed God's love to shape and transform them. Some were great leaders or martyrs, others were mothers, teachers, labourers and children who lived the gospel in the ordinary circumstances of daily life. They remind us that holiness is not about perfection without weakness, but about faithfulness, the humble perseverance of love and trust in God's mercy.

The Second Vatican Council's document, Lumen Gentium, speaks clearly: "The Lord Jesus, the divine teacher and master, has taught every one of His disciples to follow the way of holiness. Holiness therefore is not the privilege of a few chosen souls but the vocation of all. It is the goal towards which every Christian journey leads". To be holy means to live in friendship with God, to reflect His love in our relationships and to let the light of Christ shine through our lives. Holiness does not depend on great deeds or extraordinary visions. It grows in the simple and hidden acts of daily love in patience, in forgiveness, in prayer, in kindness. St. Thérèse of Lisieux called this 'the little way', doing small things with great love. In the eyes of the world, such acts may seem insignificant, but in the eyes of God, they are radiant with grace. To live a life of holiness involves being vigilant of anything unholy. There is a saying in Latin "lex orandi, lex credendi, lex vivendi" That means, what we pray or celebrate is what we believe and what we believe is what we live. If we celebrate holiness in daily life, that will become part of our lives. But if we celebrate unholiness and evil, slowly we normalise evil, which makes us unholy. In today's world, to become a saint means to live the beatitudes of Jesus. The beatitudes are not abstract ideas. They are the portrait of Christ himself. To be poor in spirit is to rely on God more than on possessions or status. To be meek is to choose gentleness over power. To hunger and thirst for righteousness is to seek truth and justice. To be merciful is to forgive. Pope Francis often speaks of the saints next door, people who live the gospel in silence, who do good without recognition, who radiate peace and love in their families and communities. These ordinary saints show us that sanctity is not about leaving the world behind but about bringing God's presence into the world. As we celebrate All Saints, their lives remind us that Heaven is our true home and that holiness is the most beautiful destiny of the human heart. May their prayers sustain us as we strive to walk the same path, living each day with faith, hope and love until the day we are united with them in the eternal joy of God's kingdom.
