#### **GIVING TO OTHERS THIS CHRISTMAS**

Christmas Giving Tree: SVP will be putting up a Christmas Giving Tree for parishioners to donate gifts for children. Fr Hudson Care have asked that donated gifts change this year, according to the ages of the children: 11- 15 yrs: Amazon Gift vouchers. These should be put in an envelope with the amount written IN PENCIL on the front. The envelopes can be decorated. 7-10 Yrs: gifts as usual but placed in GIFT BAGS not wrapped, with ages written on the angel tags. 0-6 yrs: Gifts for this age group are not needed as another Parish and a corporate are taking care of this age group. The Tree will be ready on 30th November for you to take an Angel tag, an envelope, or both. Please put the age range on the tag. Gifts can be left under the tree. Please leave your gift bags and envelopes under the tree on Sundays. They will be put in a safe place after each Mass. Fr Hudson Care will be collecting the gifts on December 15th.

## Next Sunday's Mass Readings

2 Samuel 5:1-3;

Psalm 122(121);

Colossians 1:12-20;

Luke 23:35-43

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, in today's first reading, Malachi speaks of the day of the Lord. He employs two pictures to describe this. First, he speaks of the fate of the Evil One, and then, second, the triumph of the righteous who endures till the end. This reading serves as an encouragement to help us continue patiently doing good works. The prophet ends with a promise of victory: "But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays". This is our hope and the reward.

In the second reading St. Paul similarly encourages us to keep working hard for the Kingdom of God. This is in order to earn our earthly and heavenly living. Christ's message does not in any way promote laziness or idleness. Hence, He teaches us that sloth, the reluctance to work, is one of the seven capital sins. Saint Thomas Aquinas wrote, "Sloth is the sluggishness of the mind which neglects to begin well. It is evil in its effect. It oppresses man to draw him away entirely from good deeds" (Summa Theologia 2, 35, art. 1). Hard work yields good and enduring fruits. Hard work makes a good Christian. It abhors laziness and idleness. Sadly, many Christians today no longer appreciate hard work and endurance; we always expect instant result. In order to make fast and cheap money some engage in all sorts of evil ways and means to achieve their goals. This is what Paul means by: "Now we hear that some of you are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with anyone else's". A lazy Christian yields easily to all sorts of vices.

In the Gospel Christ prophesied the end of a time in the history of Israel. He also spoke of the imminent hardships and persecution before, during and after this time. However, He concludes with these encouraging words: "Your endurance will win you your lives". Hence, the Lord encourages us to persevere in righteousness and endure difficult moments. By warning that the Temple of Jerusalem would be destroyed despite its elegance and greatness, Christ also reminds us that nothing in this world will last forever, no matter how precious it is to us. The only thing that will endure is our faith in Christ. Finally, today in our families, offices, businesses, careers and in our world at large, we face difficulties that at times question our faith. However, if we endure all these patiently as Christ tells us, we shall have enough reasons to smile at the end, and of course, "the sun of righteousness will shine on us with healing in its rays". May God bless us with the grace of patience and the gift of endurance.
