GIVING TO OTHERS THIS CHRISTMAS

<u>Christmas Giving Tree:</u> SVP will be putting up a Christmas Giving Tree for parishioners to donate gifts for children. Fr Hudson Care have asked that donated gifts change this year, according to the ages of the children: **11- 15 yrs: Amazon Gift vouchers.** These should be put in an envelope with the amount written IN PENCIL on the front. The envelopes can be decorated. **7-10 Yrs:** gifts as usual but placed in **GIFT BAGS not wrapped,** with ages written on the angel tags. **0-6 yrs:** Gifts for this age group **are not needed** as another Parish and a corporate are taking care of this age group. The Tree will be ready on **30th November f**or you to take an Angel tag, an envelope, or both. Please put the age range on the tag. Gifts can be left under the tree. Please leave your gift bags and envelopes under the tree on Sundays. They will be put in a safe place after each Mass. Fr Hudson Care will be collecting the gifts on **December 15th.**

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 2:1-5;

Psalm 122(121);

Romans 13:11-14a;

Matthew 34:37-44

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

In the middle of St Peter's Square in Rome, there stands a great obelisk. It about four and half thousand years old and it originally stood in the Temple of the Sun in the Egyptian city of Heliopolis. But it was brought to Rome by the dreadful Emperor Caligula and it was set right in the middle of Circus of Nero, on the Vatican hill. It was in that circus that St Peter was martyred. On top of the obelisk there now stands a cross and on the pedestal of the obelisk there are two inscriptions. The first of them in Latin, "Christus vincit, Christus regnat, Christus imperat", which translated means, Christ conquers, Christ rules, Christ reigns supreme. The other inscription, "The Lion of Judah has conquered". Pope Sixtus V repurposed a pagan monument into a symbol of the Church's triumph over the Roman Empire. It represented the victory of the Church, early Christians, and St. Peter himself and here in the middle of St Peter's Square stands the obelisk bearing those triumphant inscriptions as a constant reminder of the blood spilled and the endurance of the early Christians.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King which marks the end of Church's liturgical year. Instituting this Feast of Christ the King in 1925, Pope Pius XI proclaimed: "Pax Christi in regno Christi" (the peace of Christ in the reign of Christ). This feast was established and proclaimed to reassert the sovereignty of Christ and the Church over all forms of government and to remind Christians of the fidelity and loyalty they owed to Christ, who by His incarnation and sacrificial death on the cross had made them both adopted children of God and citizens and heirs of the Kingdom of Heaven. Although emperors and kings with real ruling power exist today only in history books, we nevertheless honour Christ as the King of the Universe and the King of our hearts by allowing Him to take control of our lives. In thousands of human hearts all over the world Jesus still reigns as King. The Cross is His throne and the Sermon on the Mount, His rule of law. What is the Kingdom of God? What is the Kingdom of Christ the King? Here is a beautiful explanation given by Gerald Darring (St. Louis University: Center for Liturgy): The Kingdom of God is a space. It exists in every home where parents and children love each other. It exists in every region and country that cares for its weak and vulnerable. It exists in every parish that reaches out to the needy. The Kingdom of God is a time. It happens whenever someone feeds a hungry person, or shelters a homeless person, or shows care to a neglected person. It happens whenever we overturn an unjust law or correct an injustice or avert a war. It happens whenever people join in the struggle to overcome poverty, to erase ignorance, to pass on the Faith. The Kingdom of God is present in the work of the Church and in the efforts of many others to create a world of goodness and justice.

As we celebrate the Kingship of Christ today, let us remember the truth that Christ is our King and we belong to His Kingdom only when we try to walk with Him, when we try to live our lives fully in the spirit of the Gospel and when that Gospel spirit penetrates every facet of our living. If Christ is really King of my life, He must be King of every part of my life, and I must let Him reign in all parts of my life. By cultivating in our lives the gentle and humble mind of Christ, we show others that Jesus Christ is indeed our King and that He is in charge of our lives. We pray today that God may free all the world to rejoice in His peace, to glory in His justice, to live in His love.
