

GIVING TO OTHERS THIS CHRISTMAS

<u>Christmas Giving Tree:</u> SVP will be putting up a Christmas Giving Tree for parishioners to donate gifts for children. Fr Hudson Care have asked that donated gifts change this year, according to the ages of the children: **11- 15 yrs: Amazon Gift vouchers.** These should be put in an envelope with the amount written IN PENCIL on the front. The envelopes can be decorated. **7-10 Yrs:** gifts as usual but placed in **GIFT BAGS not wrapped,** with ages written on the angel tags. **0-6 yrs:** Gifts for this age group **are not needed** as another Parish and a corporate are taking care of this age group. The Tree will be ready on **30th November f**or you to take an Angel tag, an envelope, or both. Please put the age range on the tag. Gifts can be left under the tree. Please leave your gift bags and envelopes under the tree on Sundays. They will be put in a safe place after each Mass. Fr Hudson Care will be collecting the gifts on **December 15th.**

If you wish to write a card, DO NOT put any money in the card and DO NOT add your name. "From Sacred Heart Parish" is acceptable. Leave the envelope open as all mail has to be checked at the Prison. Leave your card in the appropriate box at the back of the Church. A 50p donation towards the cost of the card would be appreciated.

Next Sunday's
Mass Readings
Isaiah 11:1-10;
Psalm 72(71);
Romans 15:4-9;
Matthew 3:1-12

Life is a recurrent foreground of expectations. It is often impossible to live without some forms of expectations. Today the Church enters her annual season of expectation, namely, for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ not just at Christmas but into our lives as we also prepare for his second coming: the Parousia. The Advent period opens with the message of future hope beyond the many challenges and unfortunate moments of the past and the present. Hope is a central theme to the season of Advent and is apparent throughout the next four weeks. It is a foundation for our belief that Jesus is coming into our hearts and the world. This first week prepares us to be people of hope and believe that darkness will not prevail but that the light of the world will overcome it.

The community to whom Jeremiah speaks in today's first reading was living in a time of uncertainty and political tractions. The Babylonian army inflicted a catastrophic defeat on Jerusalem. Several people were deported from their homeland, others were enslaved in their own land and Jeremiah was in prison. It was a time of turmoil and chaos, and it is in this time of darkness that Jeremiah speaks words of hope and restoration. The most devastating consequence of the Babylonian Exile was the end of the Davidic dynasty as they destroyed David's city, burned Solomon's temple, and took David's heirs into exile. The promises of God seemed to have come to an end. All seemed lost, but God was still faithful and He promised that 'A branch will sprout'. Historically, of course, the Davidic line did not return to the throne, and hence these passages were in time interpreted to be speaking about the coming of the Messiah.

This Season of Advent invites us to adopt three simple attitudes in our daily life. Hopefulness, Openness to being surprised by God and Living in joy. 1)Hopefulness: Christian hopefulness is not mere wishful thinking, but a confident and joyful expectation of God's promises. The foundation of this hope is God himself and His actions, both historically (like the resurrection of Jesus) and through the Holy Spirit. This hope is a focus on eternity which looks forward to ultimate deliverance from sin, a future with Christ and eternal life. This confident expectation helps Christians to endure suffering, avoid fear and live a life of joyful anticipation and good works, as their labour is seen as "not in vain". 2) Openness: Openness to being surprised by God. Anyone who is a man or a woman of hope – the great hope which faith gives us – knows that even in the midst of difficulties God acts and He surprises us. God always surprises us: like the new wine at the wedding at Cana, God always saves the best for us. But He asks us to let ourselves be surprised by His love, to accept His surprises. Let us trust God! Cut off from Him, the wine of joy, the wine of hope, runs out. If we draw near to Him, if we stay with Him, what seems to be cold water - difficulty or sin - is changed into the new wine of friendship with him. 3)Living in joy: if we walk in hope, allowing ourselves to be surprised by the new wine which Jesus offers us, we have joy in our hearts and we cannot fail to be witnesses of this joy. Christians are called to be joyful; we are never gloomy. God is at our side. We have a Mother who always intercedes for the life of her children. Jesus has shown us that the face of God is that of a loving Father. Sin and death have been defeated. Christians cannot be pessimists! We do not look like people in constant mourning. If we are truly in love with Christ and if we sense how much He loves us, our heart will "light up" with a joy that spreads to everyone around us. Advent invites us to imagine a different kind of hope, rooted in the unchanging nature of God and His promise to restore every part of His creation. Advent hope does not minimize pain or difficulty, nor does it assume things will soon get better. Instead, it faces the darkness with courage and chooses to trust that God's promises will come to pass, guaranteed by His long-proven, faithful character.
