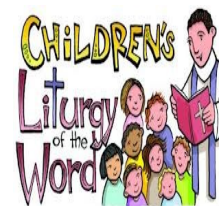
## WE ARE NOW ACCEPTING CONTACTLESS DONATIONS

### **Next Sunday's Mass**

#### **Readings**

*Baruch 5: 1-9;*

*Psalms 125;*

*Philippians 1: 3-6,  
8-11;*

*Luke 3: 1-6*

*Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.*

### **Awake, be ready!**

Since the beginning of civilization there has been a curiosity to know about the end of the world. In addition to Christianity, all the religions speak about this. Recently these notions have even crept in to Hollywood movies, such as the film called 2012 which draws an ancient Mesoamerican prophecy. It depicts the world ending on 21st December 2012 with frightening scenes of mountains flooding with water, continents falling into the sea, catastrophic destruction and cataclysmic events taking place. The core theme of the film shows the powerlessness to save ourselves from impending cataclysmic events. Leaving us with one question: who will survive in 2012?

Today's reading speaks about the end of time. But unlike Mesoamerican prophecy, it does not tell us when it will come. The Church includes this reading at the beginning of advent to remind us about the second coming of Jesus with frightening description. We would not be human if we did not tremble before these words. We would not be Christian if they did not lead us to hope. These powerful words bring us to the heart of the advent season. The truth is that God's love for us is the most powerful force in the world and not even the end of the world can change that truth. These words make us aware of our own powerlessness before some pending future events. But they also point out the power of our Saviour who one day will atomise all this order and sin and restore all creation to its original design. Christian faith and hope is not just optimism, which simply trying to find out the best out of a difficult situation. Rather Christian faith and hope tells us that love rules the universe and God's love in the end will conquer everything. These readings are not meant simply to frighten us or to worry us who will survive. But to arouse us from our sleeping. It strengthens our vision so that Christ one day will make right all that is wrong in the world, with His power of undying love for us. Our task is to welcome Christ and be ready when He comes.

In this liturgy we proclaim, that Christ has come and Christ will come again. We also proclaim that our duty is to welcome Him into our hearts right now and let His love reign over our lives. To trust Him with all that burdens and afflicts us and believe that He acts now in our midst. Our task in other words is to bring ourselves into harmony with Christ. Who is like Isaiah says, "the gentile rain that brings us salvation". In many ways this is like a story about a village that was experiencing a terrible drought that they thought that their world is going to come to an end. They tried everything; they even consulted the local rain makers to see if they could help but none. But they heard someone who lived in a far away land who is a rain maker and they called him and begged him to help them. In return they offered him anything he wanted. But he said, I don't want anything, but a quiet place where I can be alone and they offered him a cave way up in the hills where he hid away for four days. Nothing happened since and the people began to worry and on the fifth day the heavens opened and rainwater gradually quenched the thirst of the parched earth. The people established it as a miracle. But he replies I did nothing; but I come from a place where everything is in harmony, there is order there and life is in line with heaven. But when I arrived here, I saw the way you treat each other when I felt discord and division, I saw confusion and the lack of understanding a total disharmony with heaven. So I spent four days myself in harmony with the divine and then the rain came. When we live in harmony with the divine, peace, joy and blessings rain down from heaven and quench the thirst of ourselves. May God bless us. Fr. George Mathew SCJ
